



How to Avoid Home Remodeling Nightmares

- How do you handle change orders?
- When will we need to meet during the project?

2. THE PICKUP TRUCK CONTRACTOR

Many of the renovation horror stories we hear have to do with "pickup truck contractors." Homeowners hire a jack-of-all-trades to complete their remodel, instead of a trusted builder with professional subcontractors, looking forward to a lower cost and a simplified process. But in reality, these types of remodelers often don't have the trade or time management skills to complete the job properly under deadline.

3. THE DIY HOMEOWNER

The biggest nightmare often happens when a homeowner starts the project on their own without a permit or a plan. They try to hire all of the sub-contractors themselves without hiring a builder.
